



Auction Participant (Donor & Buyer) Pandemic Guidelines

Version November 20, 2020

During this pandemic, everyone is at some risk of contracting Covid-19 and, in many cases, one cannot know all the potential sources of a Covid-19 illness. UUCC encourages donors and buyers to engage in “best practices” for minimizing the spread of Covid-19 but UUCC is not responsible for the health of buyers and donors of auction items and events.

When you register for the Auction we trust that you will agree that in order to participate as a Donor or Buyer for any in-person events that on the day of the event you:

- Do not have a fever (>100 F)
- Do not have Covid-19 or Flu like symptoms
- Have not been in contact with anyone in the prior 2 weeks that has Covid-19 or tested positive for Covid-19

For this auction we are asking for in-person events to take place in warmer weather so that they can be outside. This means the Spring, Summer and Fall months of 2021. We are asking that donors follow the current County and CDC Guidelines as a minimum in their donations and adjust as permitted per any new guidelines for the actual event.

The current CDC Guidelines for Events and Gatherings can be read [here](#). Among those guidelines is this general categorization of risk at events:

- Lowest risk: Virtual-only activities, events, and gatherings. Ex.: A Zoom concert.
- More risk: Smaller outdoor and in-person gatherings in which individuals from different households remain spaced at least 6 feet apart, wear masks and do not share objects. Ex.: An outdoor dinner for 6 people where masks are only removed while drinking or dining and buyers sit with household individuals located at least 6 feet from others.
- Higher risk: Medium-sized outdoor in-person gatherings that are adapted to allow individuals to remain spaced at least 6 feet apart and wear masks when 6' is temporarily not maintainable. Ex.: An outdoor concert with room for individuals to spread out to meet the 6-foot minimum and wear masks when necessary.
- Highest risk: Large in-person gatherings where it is difficult for individuals to remain spaced at least 6 feet apart. Personal services requiring spacing closer than 6 feet. Such events are not approved for donating.

Where appropriate, a donor should clarify in their description if they have an event or service with special risk considerations. If the bidder is not comfortable with the proposed arrangement,



then they should discuss it with the donor PRIOR TO bidding or not bid on it. Ex: Home services where a single individual will wear a mask and gloves while indoors and maintain a 6-foot spacing with the masked homeowner.

For tangible items, the winning bidder(s) are responsible to pick up the item(s) from the donor at a mutually agreed upon time and date or make arrangements for someone to do so for them. Masks should be worn by both parties for the exchange.
